What is coccidiosis?

Parasite that sits in the intestinal cells.


- Damages the gut lining of small and large intestine.
- Diarrhoea: mucous ± blood
- Straining and pain
- Weight loss

How do calves get coccidiosis?



Coccidia spread via faeces

- Calves infected when they eat contaminated feed/water
- Oocysts can survive in environment for two years



What are the main risk factors for coccidiosis?

High oocyst challenge

Faeces in water or food supply

Dirty conditions

Heavily stocked

Older calves previously in environment

Susceptible calves

Up to 8 months of age


No previous exposure to coccidia

Environmental stress

Nutritional stress

What causes the signs?



- Coccidia enter intestinal cells, divide and multiply.
- Release ruptures cells.
- Severe damage loss of mucosa.
 - Significant time to recover.
 - Particularly if reinfection

Coccidiosis – what should you do about it?

- 1. Recognise the clinical signs these are almost diagnostic (particularly in housed calves).
- 2. Faeces can be used for diagnosis.
- 3. Treat early and effectively.
- 4. Focus on prevention.
- 5. Know the key risk factors keep feeding and water troughs clean.

Treating coccidiosis

- Affected calves are best treated with toltrazuril
 - single dose oral treatment
 - treat all animals in group
- Authorised for use in housed calves only
- Use diclazuril in calves at pasture (or house)
 - may need repeat dose (14 days)

Prevention of coccidiosis

- This is crucial need to prevent subclinical losses
- Toltrazuril / diclazuril
 - Treat after exposure
- In feed coccidiostats (e.g. decoquinate)
 May get losses when removed
- Improve hygiene
